Message from UNLWC 2025-26 President, Nancy Weller

Dear UNLWC Members,

Happy 2026!!!! Can you believe our club has been in existence since 1894? Shortly after the opening of the University of Nebraska, faculty women were invited to the home of Flavia Canfield, wife of Richard Canfield, Chancellor of the University, to consider forming themselves into a club. That is how it all began and the UNLWC is still here.

I recently had a conversation with a UNL faculty member who had never heard of our club. He wanted to know more and I was willing to tell him. After that conversation, I reflected on why our club is in existence after all these years. I believe the UNLWC remains strong because of the many wise women who have belonged to this group, both today and in the past. Our members have been dynamic, inquisitive and forward thinkers, ready to change with the times to meet the needs of its members and the students at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

One of the first activities of the club was to serve supper to the University football team, the Bugeaters. Now we donate food to students experiencing food insecurity and provide personal care items to the Husker Pantry.

In 1924 the group presented their first two scholarships to University students for \$50 each. This spring, nine scholarships will be awarded to students for \$2,500 each. In 1943, club members were encouraged to help with surgical dressings as they had done during WW1. In 2020, club members recognized the need and made masks for students during the COVID epidemic.

Our club's original goals of fostering good fellowship among its members while also increasing our ability to support University students certainly has been met throughout the 131 years of our club's existence. The membership has remained true to the original aims of that first group of women and has continued to thrive. We look forward to many more successful years to come.

Membership is open to any person who is interested in the activities, well-being, and continuance of the University of Nebraska and the UNL Women's Club.

Let's Try Again: The Bell Affair

In 2025, the UNLWC program committee planned to showcase the work of a multi-disciplinary team of UNL faculty who had collaborated to create an historical documentary film entitled The Bell Affair. This animated-live action film tells the story of Daniel and Mary Bell who went to court to sue for their freedom from slavery and won. After slaveholders threatened to re-enslave them and their children, the Bells led one of the largest escape attempts in American history.

The Bell Affair originally premiered on Amazon Prime. Since then, it has been featured in national and international film festivals, where it has won multiple awards. Director Kwakiutl Dreher and Producer/Art Director Michael Burton agreed to share with UNLWC members how their innovation project came to life during the COVID-19 pandemic. The filmmakers also planned to discuss the unique challenges they faced, including working with actors located across the country and filming without ever bringing the cast together in the same place.

Unfortunately, poor weather intervened, prompting the workshop to be cancelled. Many of you expressed disappointment in this outcome and suggested that we try again in 2026.

The program committee agreed and went one step further, asking OLLI (the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute) to partner with the UNLWC to bring the film to our members and the community.

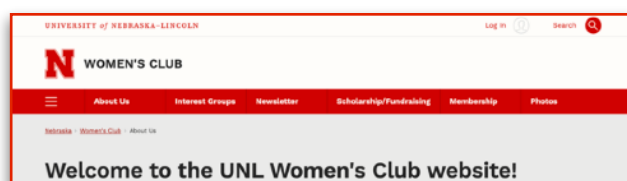

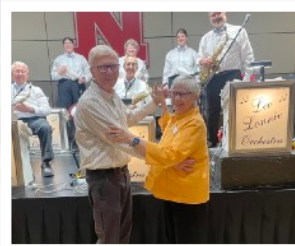

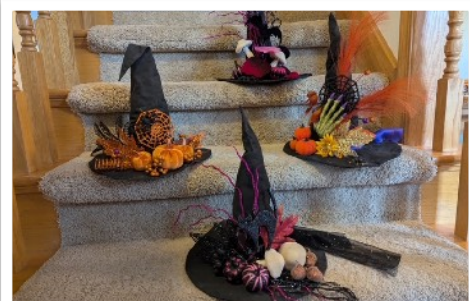
